THE FAMILYSEARCH FAMILY TREE

With more than 1.2 billion names, the **FamilySearch Family Tree** is an excellent resource for genealogists around the world. Unlike other online tree websites wherein each user has his own family tree (such as Ancestry.com <www. ancestry.com> and MyHeritage <www.myheritage.com>), FamilySearch combines its users' family "trees" into just one global Family Tree.

Remember: Any user can edit and view profiles of deceased individuals on the FamilySearch Family Tree. Set up notifications to keep track of changes others have made.



SEARCHING FOR RECORDS

Using the Main Search Form

The main search form <www.familysearch.org/search> allows you to search all of FamilySearch's indexed records at once. This can be a blessing and a curse. With too broad of a search, you'll have to sort through millions of results (many of them irrelevant). But with too narrow of a search, you'll risk missing important records. With the right fields filled in, you can deftly navigate FamilySearch's more than 7 billion indexed record results.

FamilySearch is totally, 100% free. However, the site has additional features only for LDS Church members.



SEARCHING FOR RECO

Researching by Location

Drill down to record collections from specific places. From the main search page, choose a region from the clickable world map, then select a country or (for the United States and Canada) state/ province.

You'll be directed to a landing page (see right) with a form that searches just records from that location, plus (if available) information about current indexing projects and links to relevant Learning Center courses and FamilySearch Research Wiki pages.

Step 1: Choose a collection. Though FamilySearch and its army of volunteers are indexing records every day, you may occasionally need to access collections that are still browse-only. Navigate to the collection using the instructions under "Searching Individual Collections" in this guide. Click Browse Images either from the collection list or from the collection's landing page.



Step 3: Start with a page, then move forward and backward. By default, you'll begin on page 1 of the record set you've selected. You'll likely need to employ a trial-anderror system to find the page with your ancestor's information. Enter a number in the box, then hit Enter to jump to a different page. Scan the image to see if it applies to your ancestor. If it doesn't, use the arrows to navigate forward or backward until you find the right image-or where the right image should be-based on how the volume is organized.



Step 2: Select a volume. You'll be asked to pick from drilldown options, such as locality or volume (which might be organized by record type, year or surname).

Step 4: Save the record. Once you've found a match, download the record to your Source Box, attach it to the Family Tree, or save it to your desktop. You can also print the record.

Volunteering at FamilySearch

If you'd like to give back to the genealogy community, consider donating your time as a volunteer through FamilySearch <www.familysearch.org/help/volunteer>. You can get involved by taking user surveys, donating to FamilySearch (in terms of time, money, or even records or programming skills), or serving as a family history missionary.

Volunteer indexers help make records keywordsearchable, opening them up for researchers around the world. FHCs—as well as FamilySearch Affiliate Libraries—also have special access to FamilySearch.org, including more digitized records than are available to individual users.
